DriveAbility Scotland was established in Glasgow in 2021 to provide driver and passenger assessments and advice on driving and vehicle adaptation for disabled and older people in Scotland. We are now expanding our services with the aim of reaching all those in need of support across Scotland, including the Highlands and Islands. We are now recruiting additional staff both in Glasgow and outreach facilities and have an exciting opportunity for an experienced clinician to join our team at DriveAbility Scotland.

DriveAbility Scotland is a registered Charity in Scotland and is part of the nationwide network of Mobility Centres under the umbrella of Driving Mobility – see <https://www.drivingmobility.org.uk/>

We are looking for a clinician who wants to develop their skills and knowledge in client assessments, and support our specialist assessments, which include driving, car seats, technology and powered wheelchairs and scooter assessments.

You will need to bring enthusiasm and have experience of conducting assessments with children and adults. You will need to be able to write professional reports as these are an important part of our assessments and work with agencies such as the DVLA/Motability/Police. Experience in cognitive testing would also be desirable.

An induction period is provided with further training on the job and ongoing supervision and professional development. There will also be a mandatory post-graduate certificate in Driving Assessment and Outdoor Mobility to be completed within 3 years of employment.

What support will I get?
